Plastic Bag Recycling Challenge



Will County Green is proud to partner with TREX Company, Inc. to offer a plastic bag recycling program. TREX

utilizes millions of plastic bags each year to create its composite lumber product, keeping this material out of the landfills, locally and across the country. By building a partnership with schools, students can learn the importance of recycling, keep plastic out of the landfills and be rewarded for their efforts.

Of course, the best solution to the abundance of plastic shopping bags we all experience is to use cloth reusable bags for our shopping needs. But even with all of our good intentions, some plastic bags do become a part of our lives. This challenge gives students and their families an opportunity to properly recycle those inevitable plastic items.

TREX will be offering the school bringing in the most bags (per capita) a recycled plastic bench. Also, each participating school will receive a birdhouse made of TREX lumber. The bag collection will begin on October 1 and run until April 22 (Earth Day).

Each participating school will receive a cardboard box to hold 500 bags. When the box is filled, a school volunteer will take the bags to a participating local store. TREX will subsequently pick up those bags.

We are proud to announce that we will continue to provide Will County classrooms with vermicomposting (worm) bins. Worms will break down vegetable and food scraps into

We are able to provide one bin per school for the academic year. If a teacher in your school has previously maintained a bin, a different teacher can still qualify for a new bin. All requests must be received by December 15.

Will County: Looking for Energy-Efficient Schools

Will County has joined the Federal Dept. of Energy's Better Building Challenge (BBC). The county has committed to reduce energy use by 20% by 2020 (using 2009 energy use as the



benchmark). This goal covers many, but not all, county owned buildings. The goal is expected to be achieved through implementation of:

- Energy management procedures
- Employee green team actions
- Education
- Energy audits
- Energy efficient retrofits

The BBC also involves challenging businesses, schools, and municipalities to reduce energy consumption. Will County will be working with businesses and schools through its Green Business Program to achieve BBC goals. Will County will use software that is available to many commercial businesses through the US EPA, known as the Energy Portfolio Manager to track energy usage. The County's commitment is for over 500,000 sq. ft. and one of the improvements has now begun with the County Sunny Hill Nursing Home. This 24/7 operation is receiving a reflective roof that will boost the insulation value as well as reduce cooling costs.

Will County encourages schools to work to achieve these goals. Has your school been involved since 2009 in any energy-saving measures? We Want to Be a Will County Earth Flag School!

(Schools are encouraged to reapply yearly)



Complete 4 Earth Tasks:

Recycle Paper and one additional material (ink cartridges, cans, bottles, plastic bags, etc.) **Use Both Sides** of photocopies or loose leaf paper; institute a double-sided policy. **Invite Will County** to your school for a presentation to one grade level or environmental group.

- Students and faculty become environmental ambassadors to the remainder of the school.
- Follow-up report submitted to Will County related to information presented.

Perform Two Activities of Your Choice involving one grade level or school club by May 1, 2013.

- Host a collection event to save landfill space and give items a new purpose (shoes, clothing, books, etc.) Schools may donate several bags to the Will County Textile Collection in May.
- Start an environmental club (meet at least monthly to discuss environmental topics);
- Start composting organic food scraps at school (using outdoor compost bin or classroom vermicomposting bin);
- Perform at least 2 waste-free lunch days during the school year;
- Host a recycled art fair to showcase student projects;
- Become a Lights4Learning school;
- Entire school uses natural lighting one hour a month, eliminating overhead lights (Earth Hour);
- Join Will County's Better Buildings Challenge in partnership with the Department of Energy;

Presentations will be a minimum of 30 minutes and a maximum of 45 minutes. If multiple presentations are in the same day, the representative will need 15 minutes between classes for set-up/moving. Smaller groups are far more effective than large assemblies. We prefer to give several presentations in a school to groups with fewer than 40 students. In some buildings, this can mean that the presentations will be spread over two days.

During the 2012-2013 school year, the presentations will focus on energy conservation and alternate forms of energy, in addition to recycling.
