- Never leave dips or salads that require refrigeration out over 2 hours.
- This is also true for meat.



State HHW Event in Aurora 6/5

Register now for this Saturday, June 5 event in Aurora offered by the Illinois EPA. This Household Hazardous Waste Collection accepts oil-based paints, pesticides, pool chemicals, fertilizers, all types of automotive fluids, including the oil filter. Batteries that are rechargeable, mercury containing items and more. This event runs 8am to 3pm and is open to all Illinois residents. **Registration is required.**



When to Water Lawn & Garden

If you are a morning person, this is great news, the best time to water your lawn and garden is before 9am so the plants have a chance to absorb the moisture. If you prefer to water in the evening, consider getting a sprinkler or irrigation system with a timer so you can sleep or work early and still water at the best time. Midday watering evaporates too quickly and evening watering can lead to plant disease if too much is given. Also, try to avoid watering when it rains, that is just a waste. Add a rain barrel where possible.

Facebook Fan Question about Hangers

Return the thin metal ones to a dry cleaner, donate the plastic and metal/plastic combo hangers to thrift stores. Ask your retailer of choice if they reuse or recycle them. If they are plastic and broken, no longer reusable, please know that they need to be placed in the garbage. NEVER place in the recycling. Metal ones in poor condition will be taken at most scrap collections.


