For 15 years Will County has been working with ShareFest to offer a unique collection event and for nearly as long, the Village of New Lenox and New Lenox Township have financially supported an annual Household Hazardous Waste collection as part of the event. Once again, on the second Saturday of September, we will have numerous volunteers and a variety of organizations offering to reuse, recycle and properly dispose of Electronics, Scrap Wood, Scrap Metal, Clean Polystyrene (a.k.a. Styrofoam - no peanuts), Clothing, Books, Toys, food, items for the Troops, American Flags in poor condition, small home goods such as cookware, and hazardous items such as lawn and pool chemicals, automotive fluids, mercury containing items, medications and more. ## Will County Earns Recognition

Since 2019, several of Will County's buildings have participated in demand response, a program that supports the resilience of the electrical grid by reducing energy use on days with high demand. This limits the strain on the regional electric system and helps prevent blackouts and brownouts on very hot or cold days.

To honor the County's demand response participation, NRG and the Arbor Day Foundation are planting 10 trees in Superior National Forest in northeastern Minnesota on behalf of the County within 12 months.

## Electric Vehicle Adoption Growing

In a recent article in American City and County magazine, the dramatic growth of electric vehicles market over this past decade was covered. "As costs for vital elements like batteries has declined, vehicle sales have steadily picked up. Hybrids, plug-in hybrids, and fully electric cars accounted for approximately 11 percent of light-duty vehicle sales in the fourth quarter of 2021, with EVs (electric vehicles) alone accounting for 3.4 percent of light-duty vehicle sales. In a comparison of all U.S. states, California leads in adoption and sales of EVs, although usage is increasing in states like Florida, Texas and Washington." Illinois has been ranked high in adoption with the latest data from our state DMV showing nearly 3,000 EVs owned by Will County residents.

## Landfill Gas to Power Transportation

Three years ago Will County initiated the process to build a Renewable Natural Gas (RNG) Plant as a far better environmental use of the methane gas being flared off from the county's landfill. Over this time, several RR&E staff, with assistance from contractors, engineers and others, have been working diligently to turn this vision into a reality. The RNG plant, located at the Prairie View Landfill will utilize a 5.5 mile pipeline to deliver Compressed Natural Gas (CNG) fuel into a pipeline for use in trucks of various types that run on CNG instead of diesel. This unique project creates a renewable fuel that shall generate revenue for the County for decades to come. Stay tuned for more updates and a ribbon cutting ceremony in the near future.

## Composting 101 on Sun, Sept 18

The Will County Environmental Educator, Joan O'Keefe, will teach a 30 minute Composting class offering easy steps for homeowners to start composting in their own backyards using a compost bin. Up to 40% of our municipal waste stream can be recycled into a beneficial soil amendment. County rules and guidelines will be discussed as well as vermicomposting for multi-family dwellers. The composting presentation will be followed at 3:30 pm by a presentation on other gardening practices that are beneficial for building good soil and conserving water from Nancy Cinatl of The Conservation Foundation staff. This event will be at the McDonald Farm, 10 S 404 Knock Knolls Rd, in Naperville starting at 2:30pm on Sunday, 9/18.



A limited quantity of Earth Machine compost bins will be available for sale as well as Upcycle Products' stationary, and tumbling compost bins, and rain barrels.

## Reducing Confusion - Recycling Conference at JJC

The [Illinois Recycling Foundation](#) is coming to Joliet on August 30 and 31 for a two-day conference featuring 18 sessions on a variety of reuse, recycling and composting topics. The theme is Recycling: The Secret Weapon to Combat Climate Change. State Senator Linda Holmes will be joined by County Executive Jennifer Bertino-Tarrant to welcome attendees involved in recycling and reuse businesses, colleges, cities, counties, townships, and non-profit organizations from around the state. Our local ShareFest Will County and Joliet ReStore will be offering presentations. A tour of a Romeoville compost site and some recycling plants will also be given.


