Today's sorting equipment usually discards caps placed separately in recycling bins. The Association of Postconsumer Plastic Recyclers joined with the Closure and Container Manufacturers Association (both are trade organizations) to launch a "Caps **On'**'initiative. They are calling on all of us to put the caps back on our empty plastic containers when we place them in our recycling containers.

They assure the recyclers that domestic markets exist and are growing that can sort the plastic caps from the bottles downstream.

Folks that worry or feel guilty about their habit of putting the caps back on, can now rest easy. It is official, tell your family, your friends and your co-workers, "Leave the caps on and recycle more!"
