Fresh Food Options

While many people purchase fresh fruits and vegetables at supermarkets, the summer is a great time to explore more options. Local farmers may sell direct from their farm, at a Farmer's Market or through a CSA.

A CSA is a new idea in farming. It stands for Community Supported Agriculture and allows people interested in purchasing fresh, locally produced food to invest in small, versatile family farms. Such farms grow an array of vegetables, fruits, eggs and meat; producing crops throughout the late spring, summer and fall. Many successful CSA farms become an asset to the community. They promote farmland and food supply as an important natural resource, emphasizing

Completing the event is a **Document Destruction collection** where residents may bring items with identity information that they want shredded before recycling. Residents are encouraged to tear such items up as they become unwanted, but if they have accumulated beyond your physical ability, then this is the event for you. All items are securely locked and destroyed by our contractor.

More Schools Go Green!

A record 55 schools throughout Will County were recognized for their achievements in recycling, resource conservation, and environmental education at our 13th annual Earth Flag assembly



program at Bicentennial Park in Joliet. Students of all grade levels and their teachers gathered to be recognized for year-long environmental achievements. Ten new schools were added during the 2011-2012 school year, making this the highest enrollment ever.

Schools achieve this award by completing various earth-friendly projects. Jefferson School in Plainfield collected 10 boxes of bottle caps for recycling, A. O. Marshall School installed motion-sensitive detectors on light switches, and students at Chelsea Intermediate School in Frankfort collected eight bags of garbage from the surrounding school grounds. Will County Energy Plan

Across the nation, energy supply, conservation and utilization is a concern. Will County began a process in 2009 to address these concerns by accepting a draft plan primarily for County Buildings' efficiency from our Federal EECBG consultant, CDM. In Jaunary a tackforce of members from the community, inc.



taskforce of members from the community, including energy suppliers, business, education, union representatives and elected officials was pulled together to examine the issues of:

- 1) Will County's Energy Vision;
- 2) Primary energy efficiency and conservation goals;
- 3) Data and analysis of energy consumption and air pollutant emissions;
- 4) Specific objectives and corresponding initiatives to obtain goals;
- 5) Actions intended to advance the objectives/initiatives; and
- 6) Methods for monitoring progress and recommendations for continued plan and program enhancements.

The resulting Will County Energy Efficiency and Conservation Plan is being presented to the County Board in June. Information about the Plan, the meetings and more is on the website, under <u>initiatives</u>.

This 9,000 sq. ft. bank in Lockport is a very unique bank. GreenChoice Bank believes in helping homeowners retrofit their homes to be more



energy efficient. They are currently the only bank participating in the Energy ImpACT Illinois (EI2). They offer unsecured loans to support up to 90% of the cost of boiler, furnace, water heater, and air conditioning efficiency improvements. The application process is paperless. Beyond that, they offer electric vehicle charging stations for customers, staff recycles, conserves water and electricity, uses recycled content paper with vegetable dyes on printed materials and the bank encourages green practices for employees and customers (think e-statement).
